

## \*\*\*\*\* ARE YOU A GOOD LISTENER? \*\*\*\*

t one time or another, we are all guilty of having "selective hearing." Children approach their parents, eager to share an experience or seek advice. A husband comes home and tries to relate to his wife some difficulty he encountered at work that day. A friend calls another, looking for a sympathetic ear. In cases like this, and in far too many of life's situations, it seems that we humans have this unfortunate ability to "tune out" those with whom we are speaking. We "HEAR" them, but aren't really "LISTENING."

Our Lord said on numerous occasions: "He who has ears to hear, let him hear." (Matt 11:15) One could argue that what He really meant was "He who has ears to hear, let him LISTEN," for Christ goes on to tell us: "Take heed what you hear. With the same measure you use, it will be measured to you." (Mark 4:24) It is imperative then for a good Christian to be a GOOD LISTENER. To do so, our Savior gives us words of guidance: "Do unto others as you would have others do unto you." (Matt 7:12) When we have problems & difficulties - when we have questions to ask or burdens to be lessened - don't we expect the undivided attention of the person to whom we are speaking? Of course, we do! Others expect the same of us as well. A good listener must be patient, sincere & compassionate. It must be said as well that being a good listener also means knowing when to remain silent! Those who seek our ear do not always need our advice - they merely want our silent reassurance that all will be well. Countless lives have been saved from suicide & numerous scarred souls have been healed through the simple act of COMPASSIONATE LISTENING. Rest assured, hearing is not nearly enough!

Let <u>us</u>, the faithful, praise and <u>wor</u>ship the Word, / co-eternal with the Father and the <u>Spirit</u>, / <u>born</u> for our salvation from the <u>Virgin</u>; / for He <u>willed</u> to be lifted up on the <u>Cross</u> in the flesh, / to en<u>dure</u> death, / and to <u>raise</u> the dead // by His <u>glo</u>rious Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

### Kontakion Resurrection - Tone 5

Thou didst de<u>scend</u> into hell, O my <u>Sav</u>ior, / shattering its gates as Al<u>mighty</u>, / resur<u>rec</u>ting the dead as Creator, / and de<u>stroy</u>ing the <u>sting</u> of death. / Thou hast delivered Adam from the curse, O <u>Lov</u>er of man, // and we cry to Thee: "O <u>Lord</u>, <u>save</u> us!"

### Kontakion, Triodion, Publican and Pharisee - Tone 4

Let us flee from the pride of the <u>Phar</u>isee! / Let us learn humility from the <u>Pub</u>lican's tears! / Let us cry to our <u>Sav</u>ior: / "Have <u>mer</u>cy on us, // O only <u>mer</u>ciful One!"

## **Stikhera of Repentance - Tone 8** *Sung from the Triodion on the Sundays of Pre-Lent and Great Lent.*

### Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit;

Open to me the gates of repentance, O <u>Gi</u>ver of <u>Life</u>, / For my spirit rises early to pray towards thy holy <u>te</u>mple. / Bearing the temple of my <u>bo</u>dy all de<u>filed</u>; / But in Thy compassion, // purify me by the loving <u>ki</u>ndness of Thy <u>me</u>rcy.

# Now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

<u>Lead</u> me on the paths of salvation, O <u>Mo</u>ther of <u>God</u>, / For I have profaned my soul with <u>shame</u>ful sins, / and have wasted my <u>life</u> in <u>la</u>ziness. / But by thine inter<u>ce</u>ssions, // deliver me from <u>all</u> impurity.

**Tone 6** Have mercy on <u>me</u>, O God, / according to Thy great <u>mer</u>cy; / according to Thine abundant mercy, // blot out my trans<u>gres</u>sion!

When I think of the many evil <u>things</u> I have done, / <u>wretch</u> that I <u>am</u>, / I tremble at the fearful day of <u>ju</u>dgement. / But trusting in Thy living <u>kind</u>ness, / like David I <u>cry</u> to <u>Thee</u>: / Have <u>me</u>rcy on me, O <u>God</u>, // according to Thy great <u>me</u>rcy.

## Sunday of the Publican & Pharisee, at Vigil:

**Lord, I call ... Tone 1** Brethren, let us not pray as the Pharisee: / for he who exalts himself shall be humbled. / Let us humble ourselves before God, / and with fasting cry aloud as the Publican: // God be merciful to us sinners. *Luke 18: 10–14*.

A Pharisee, overcome with vainglory, / and a Publican, bowed down in repentance, / came to Thee the only Master. / The one boasted and was deprived of blessings, / while the other kept silent and was counted worthy of gifts. / Confirm me, O Christ our God, in these his cries of sorrow, // for Thou lovest mankind.

"Glory ..." **Tone 8** Almighty Lord, I know how great is the power of tears. / For they led up Hezekiah from the gates of death; / they delivered the sinful woman from the transgressions of many years; / they justified the Publican above the Pharisee, / And with them I also pray: // Have mercy upon me. 4 [2] Kgs. 20: 1–6; Luke 7: 36–50.

**Litiya – TONE 3** Understanding, O my soul, the difference between the Publican and the Pharisee, hate the proud words of the one, and eagerly imitate the contrite prayer of the other, crying aloud: God be merciful to me a sinner and have pity on me.

**The Apostikha** "Glory ..." **- Tone 5** Mine eyes are weighed down by my transgressions, / and I cannot lift them up and see the height of heaven. / But receive me, Savior, in repentance as the Publican // and have mercy on me. *cf Prayer of Manasses*.

Exapostilarion Let us flee from the wicked boasting of the Pharisee and let us learn the noble humility of the Publican, that we may be exalted and cry aloud with him to God: Be merciful unto Thy servants, Christ our Saviour, born of a Virgin, who hast of Thine own will endured the Cross and with Thyself raised up the world by Thy divine power.

On the Praises - TONE 3 O ye faithful, let us hate the boastful words of the Pharisee and emulate the contrite prayer of the Publican. Let us not think proud thoughts, but humbling ourselves in contrition let us cry: God be merciful to our sins.

On the Praises, on "Glory ..." - TONE 8 O Lord, Thou hast condemned the Pharisee who justified himself by boasting of his works, and Thou hast justified the Publican who humbled himself and with cries of sorrow begged for mercy. For Thou dost reject proudminded thoughts, but Thou dost not despise a contrite heart. Therefore in abasement we fall down before Thee who hast suffered for our sake: grant us forgiveness and great mercy.
